As symbols of wealth, shells are second only to metal as the most common standard of value ever used. Cowrie shells have been used as money by more people in more parts of the world than any coin. As emblems of status, shells form a visual language that communicates something about its wearer and his place in society. Even today many Hindu women wear Chank shell bracelets as a symbol of marriage. As objects of ritual and myth, shells constitute an even strong language, which gives form to the intangible. More than sixty full-color photographs of shell artifacts have been made especially for this volume by Frances McLaughlin Gill. These dramatic visual images of the objects made with shells relay as never before the magic and beauty created for thousands of years by unknown craftsmen. In addition, 45 black-and-white ethnographic photos showing how people actually used and wore the shells have been gathered from many sources.
